"So it went on: 10 a day, 10,000 Jews a day. But that didn't last long. Soon it was 15,000 they wanted from Warsaw, city of Jews, the closed-off, walled city dissolving before my eyes like snow.

Warsaw! Full of Jews like in a Yom Kippur shul, like in an open market, who davend and dealt, so sad and so happy, who looked for bread and looked for God. Walled city full only of the Jews.

Now you're deserted! You've become empty! You're a cemetery more desolate than a necropolis. Your streets dead but even empty of corpses, your houses open but no-one goes in or out."

The above poem is part of their 2,500,000 archival items. The son of Holocaust survivors, Dr. Irving Berkowitz is a widely respected scholar and public speaker on the Holocaust and contemporary antisemitism. He served as Dean of Academic Affairs at Palm Beach State College for more than a decade. He recently completed a fellowship as Scholar in Residence at Oxford University's Institute for the Study of Global Antisemitism and Policy. Dr. Berkowitz has received numerous commendations, including the 2019 Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Distinguished Leadership Award, for his lifetime of scholarship, advocacy and service in relation to racism, antisemitism, hatred and discrimination. He is currently consulting on a Broadway show dealing with the Holocaust.

Edwin Black is the award-winning international investigative and best selling author of 11 books, 200 editions in 20 languages in 190 countries, as well as scores of newspaper and magazine articles in the leading publications of the United States, Europe and Israel. Since 2020, he has hosted the weekly issues-oriented and history-based "The Edwin Black Show". With more than 2.2 million books in print, Black has been interviewed on hundreds of network broadcasts around the world. He is also the recipient of multiple top editorial and human rights awards.



DAVID De JONG Nazi Billionaires: The Dark History of Germany's Wealthiest Dynasties Sunday, December 3, 2023

David de Jong is a journalist and author. His first book, *Nazi Billionaires,* will be

translated into more than twenty languages. He spent four years reporting from Berlin while researching and writing this book. His work has also appeared in the *New York Times*, the *Wall Street Journal*, and *Bloomberg Businessweek*. A native of the Netherlands, he currently lives in Tel Aviv and works as a Middle East correspondent for the Dutch *Financial Daily*.



STUART FORCE The Taylor Force Act: Halting Pay to Slay Sunday, March 17, 2024

Mr. Force has a distinguished record of service to our country as an Officer and Pilot in the United States Air Force and the Colorado Air National Guard. After retiring from the Air Force, Mr. Force was

a commercial pilot. Mr. and Mrs. Force were instrumental in ending the Palestinian Authority's policy of financially rewarding Palestinian terrorists. The bill, known as the Taylor Force Act, was named in honor of the Forces' son Taylor who was tragically murdered by a Palestinian terrorist while in Israel in 2016.



DR. JACQUES P. GAUTHIER Jerusalem and the Disputed Territories: Definitive Sovereignty in International Law Sunday, February 18, 2024

Dr. Gauthier is a Canadian international lawyer and scholar. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Geneva. He has served as legal counsel to many governments including that of France, Spain, Mexico and Canada. In 2000, he was knighted by the President of France as *Chevalier de l'Ordre National du Mérite* and in 2015 appointed *Chevalier de la Légion d'Honneur*. Dr. Gauthier has presented this lecture around the world, from London (House of Commons), to Washington (US Congress), Rome (Italian Senate), New York (United Nations), Brussels (EU Parliament), Tokyo (Japanese Parliament), Ottawa (Canadian House of Commons), The Hague (Dutch Parliament), in addition to Jerusalem, Basil, Geneva, Toronto, San Remo and beyond.



GRANT ARTHUR GOCHIN Lithuanian Holocaust Fraud Sunday, December 17, 2023

Grant Gochin currently serves as the Honorary Consul for the Republic of Togo. He is the Emeritus Special Envoy for Diaspora Affairs for the African Union, which represents the fifty-five African

nations, and Emeritus Acting Dean of the Los Angeles Consular Corps, the second largest Consular Corps in the world. Gochin is actively involved in Jewish affairs, focusing on historical justice. He has spent the past thirty years documenting and restoring signs of Jewish life in Lithuania.



ANETTE ISAACS The Tainted Legacy of Richard Wagner Sunday, November 12, 2023

German born and raised Anette Isaacs, MA, is a Historian and Public Educator who has been presenting hundreds of programs on more than 40 different

topics (all pertaining to her native country's history, politics, and culture) across the United States. She holds Master's Degrees in American Studies, Political Science, and History and is currently serving as the New Director of the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) at Florida International University (FIU) in Miami, Florida.



DR. SAMUEL KASSOW Time Capsules Under the Rubble: the Ringelblum Archive in the Warsaw Ghetto Sunday, February 4, 2024 Dr. Karsaw Charles H. Northam Brotos

Dr. Kassow, Charles H. Northam Professor of History at Trinity College, holds a

Ph.D. from Princeton University. He has been been a visiting professor at many institutions and was on the team of scholars that planned the POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews in Warsaw. Among his many books is "Who will Write our History: Emanuel Ringelblum and the Secret Ghetto Archive" which received the Orbis Prize of the AAASS and which was a finalist for a National Jewish Book Award. It has been translated into eight languages. A child of Holocaust survivors, Professor Kassow was born in a Displaced Persons camp in Germany.



JULIE STRAUSS LEVIN The Taylor Force Act: Halting Pay to Slay Sunday, March 17, 2024

Julie Strauss Levin is an attorney with extensive experience in both the forprofit and non-profit spaces. She served as General Counsel of Freedom Partners Chamber of Commerce. Ms. Strauss

Levin was Vice President and Deputy General Counsel for Feld Entertainment, Inc., the largest provider of live family entertainment in the world. She worked at several law firms representing a variety of clients, including the United States Olympic Committee. Ms. Strauss Levin was appointed to the U.S. Commission for the Preservation of America's Heritage Abroad. She also sits on the Virginia Israel Advisory Board.



DR. RALPH NURNBERGER The Rothschild Dynasty: Overcoming Antisemitism Sunday, March 31, 2024

Dr. Nurnberger is a widely acclaimed speaker who taught at Georgetown University for 38 years. He speaks frequently throughout the world. In

addition to his academic career, Dr. Nurnberger previously served as a Foreign Policy Assistant and as a professional staff member on the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. Dr. Nurnberger was the first director of "Builders for Peace", established in 1993, to support the Middle East Peace process through economic and social development. He is a Senior Partner of Nurnberger & Associates, a government relations firm founded in 1994, in Washington, D.C.



MAJOR GENERAL NADAV PADAN

International Holocaust Remembrance Day Commemoration Featuring Friends of the Israel Defense Forces, FIDF

Sunday, January 28, 2024

During his distinguished 36 years of military service in the IDF, Major General Padan has held several leadership positions, including commander of the central command and head of the cyber defense directorate. Padan began his career in the elite "Sayeret Matkal" special forces unit and went on to hold a wide range of leadership roles within the IDF. As a member of the IDF's executive leadership, Padan worked closely with Israel's highest-ranking governmental officials, including the prime minister, minister of defense, cabinet ministers and Knesset members.



CAPTAIN ITAI TZUR International Holocaust Remembrance Day Commemoration Featuring Friends of the Israel Defense Forces, FIDF Sunday, January 28, 2024

Following in the footsteps of his grandfather, a Holocaust survivor, Captain Itai joined the Naval Academy and was eventually promoted to command a Naval Patrol Battleship, charged with securing the southern maritime border along the Gaza Strip and playing an active role in Operation Guardian of the Walls in 2021. Itai has also participated in FIDF's Witness in Uniform Delegation to Poland. He is currently the Director of the Advanced Command Training Program.



DR. ROBERT WATSON The Nazi Titanic Sunday, January 21, 2024

Dr. Watson is the Distinguished Professor of American History, Avron Fogelman Research Professor, and Director of Project Civitas at Lynn University. He is an award-winning author of over 45 books and 200 scholarly articles and

essays on political and military topics. He is also a frequent media commentator in news outlets around the world, and a visiting scholar for dozens of historic sites. Dr. Watson co-founded the annual Truman Legacy Symposium for the Truman Presidential Library.



LIEUTENANT COLONEL (RET) ALLEN B. WEST The Taylor Force Act: Halting Pay to Slay Sunday, March 17, 2024

Allen B. West is a Christian constitutional conservative, a combat veteran, and former Member of the US Congress. He

is the third of four generations of military combat veterans, participating in Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm. As Battalion Commander he deployed with his unit during the Iraq War in 2003 and continued to command his battalion until his retirement from the Army in 2004 after 22 years of honorable service in defense of the Republic. In November of 2010, Allen was honored to continue his oath of service to his country when he was elected to the United States Congress, representing Florida's 22nd District.
